




Views of the log home being reassembled with a new foundation at Hope International.

The first time my husband and I attended a Hope camp meeting, we were greeted by an angel. During the time just prior to receiving an invitation for the camp meeting, we had been in the middle of a problem we were having with our pastor. We had received a free trial subscription to *Our Firm Foundation* magazine and we were impressed with the spiritual content of the magazine and felt a need to be with people of like mind.

We had only a borrowed tent and some camping gear in our little Honda as we drove to Yucaipa to spend the weekend at the 1993 camp meeting. We drove all day to get there, stopping only for gas and to eat. We arrived at the campground Thursday evening just before the first meeting and were met at the gate by a young man who looked like he was in his mid to late twenties. He was sitting on the fender of his Volkswagen bug that was filled to the roof with camping gear. He was dressed in regular street clothes and we saw nothing unusual about him. He smiled, opened the gate and directed us to the area where the meetings were going to be held and to where we should pitch our tent. We thanked him and drove in, anxious to get to the meeting that was about to begin. Time was so short when we arrived that we left our car still packed and hurried to the meeting. We walked in, sat down and listened to a wonderful sermon.

The next morning (Friday) we got dressed and attended the first meeting of the day. As the meeting began there was an announcement made apologizing for the fact that the campground had a policy of locking the gates before sunset and that many people were unable to attend the Thursday evening meeting because they were locked out. We thought that was odd since we had been met by the young man in the VW. Since the campground employees all seemed to wear uniforms we assumed that the young man was part of Hope, but if he had been, why were we the only people that he let in?

I began to think about the fact that all he had was what could fit in a Volkswagen and studied who else was camping in the tent section of the



campground. We seemed to be the only ones in a tent, so it wasn't hard to realize that he hadn't pitched a tent in the tent area. There had been no trailer that his car was pulling. Before meetings, during breaks and every chance I had, I hunted for this man that had let us in, but never once did I see anyone at the whole camp meeting that had a VW or that looked like him. Who was the man at the gate? The only explanation we could think of was that it was an angel, because what we learned at those meetings changed the direction of our lives.

We heard sermons from Dwight Hall and Tom Waters about overcoming sin in our own lives and how to be a victorious Christian. We saw other Christian Adventists who were practicing what our church used to preach. The first conviction that came to my heart was that I didn't pack the clothes a Bible believing Christian woman should have packed. Not because someone lectured me about wearing a dress rather than pants, but because they themselves wore dresses. No one said a word about how to dress, but when we broke for lunch, we made a quick trip to the local Wal-Mart and I bought two skirts to wear. The sermon that hit home powerfully to both of us was one by Tom Waters entitled: Evil Surmising or Beneficial Devising. We saw that sin in our lives and we saw the need of a change in us. We also learned from that sermon how to depend on God to overcome this (or any) sin.

There were many other powerful sermons concerning the signs of the end, including warnings of what was happening in our own church, and in hearing those, we were comforted to know that we were not alone in our concerns. The Lord richly blessed us that weekend and the lessons learned will never be forgotten. When I hear people criticize Hope, I am reminded of that angel sitting on the Volkswagen and I know that the criticism is really directed at our Lord who raised up Hope to give His distressed little flock "hope." I thank you all, and especially Ron Spear, for heeding the Lord's voice and giving us "Hope."

He ultimately had to leave Angola in August 1975 because of the war. Tony with his mother and sister, (his father stayed in Angola), traveled almost 1900 miles through the jungle and deserts to escape to South Africa. They stayed for three months in South Africa's refugee camps before flying to Portugal. After completing studies in theology in

Spain and France, he came to Portugal where in 1986 he was called to be a pastor in the Lisbon area and additionally taught Bible and Computer Science at the Seventh-day Adventist High School.


In 1987 he met Celeste and they were married in September 1988. They have two children, Mariana, 14 and Miguel, 6. 
There is a world to reach and there is no time to lose, let's do the work that God has assigned to each one of us, before probationary time closes!
